#### **Ban on Powdered Gloves**

As many of you have already heard, the FDA has officially banned powdered gloves as of January 18, 2017 in human and veterinary medicine. Risks posed by powdered gloves include hypersensitivities, peritonitis, and adhesion formation. These risks were found to be important and significant, and the prevalence of comparably priced and viable alternatives drove the declaration of this ban. Powdered gloves can no longer be obtained from manufacturers and should be disposed of if present within your clinics. For more information, please see the full AVMA announcement at
