PRESIDENT'S NOTE — SEPTEMBER 2023

Happy summertime to all my San Francisco veterinary colleagues,

I hope all is well for everyone during our often cold summer months as we ease into our warmer months here in the City by the Bay. Some find this a good time to escape for summer vacations but I am kind of liking our cooler climate. I recently had to spend a few days in Ohio with 95 degree air and 80% humidity. It felt so good to step out of the airport into a 70 degree climate back at SFO. It is easy to take our weather for granted when humans and animals are literally dying by the hundreds in other parts of the country. I mention this because we are likely to get some really hot days here in the weeks to come. As the Central Valley cools off and air stops rising there, we lose our coastal breeze here (i.e. the city's natural air conditioning). From my years in the E.R. I know there will be many dogs presenting to hospitals (mostly brachycephalic) with hyperthermia that will lead to their demise. Put up a poster in the lobby and especially for flat faced dogs, mention it during the exam. This season is a good time to warn owners of the risks. You can't remind owners enough: "Don't leave Fido in the car, even for a short period on warm days."

So we have more than just hyperthermia to consider during the summer in our neck of the woods. Thanks to global warming, fertilizer runoff, and wastewater treatment discharge there is now a constant potential for spontaneous toxic algae blooms in the ocean and Bay. We are already seeing this occur in Southern California, resulting in more than a thousand documented marine mammals dying and many suspected cases in humans and dogs. There have been numerous warnings from our local officials that we are seeing small blooms now in the Bay. A couple good resources online are:

You can also find links on treating algal toxicosis on VIN.com but I cannot post links for obvious confidentiality reasons.

For owners traveling outside of SF, also consider reminding them about the dangers of snake envenomation. Our practice was just informed of a young, healthy terrier who will not be seen again because he found a rattlesnake while on leash in Sonoma County. Living in an environmental bubble that is not home to dangerous snakes may make your clients complacent about the risks and it is a horrible way to lose your dog. Also consider vaccines for animals that regularly travel to endemic areas.

Lastly, whether you love 'em or hate 'em the Blue Angels will be bringing the noise in the first week of October. It is a good time to call those clients who have phobic animals and make sure they have some pharmacological help that is tested long before the first jet engines fire up. You might be a Gabapentin fan, maybe you mix in Trazodone. There are always pets that don't have a paradoxical effect from Xanax, but many do. Anyone a fan of repeat dosing with Sileo? Whatever your preference, try to keep your patients out of the E.R. with panic attacks or self- induced trauma by planning ahead.

On that note, everyone enjoy the warm days ahead keep your patients safe,

"Shockwave Therapy in Canine and Feline Patients"

Presented by: Dr. Jen Vitucci

This 1-hour CE presentation will discuss the technology and mechanism of action of shock wave therapy. Participants will learn what a shock wave is, different types of shock wave generation, and the mechanism of action of shock wave therapy at the cellular level. Research supporting shock wave use in small animal patients will also be discussed. Then clinical applications of shock wave therapy will be presented. Participants will learn how to apply shock wave therapy to clinical cases, how to select appropriate cases, and how to select treatment parameters. Cases will also be discussed.

After graduating with her veterinary degree from The Ohio State University in 2007, **Dr. Vitucci** moved to St. Louis with her husband Mike. They owned a small animal general practice for 12 years beforerecently moving to the Florida panhandle in 2021. Dr. Vitucci's love of geriatric patients and



improving their quality of life by treating mobility and arthritis issues led her to become a certified canine rehabilitation therapist through the Canine Rehab Institute in 2019. Since selling their practice in early 2021, she has been with PulseVet, now a Zomedica company, as the Professional Services Veterinarian for shockwave therapy.



General Guidelines

(GIA and Tauber Funds are available for any case, please use all of your funds)

- 1 The pet must have an urgent need for medical care.
- The case has a good prognosis.
- If it's a long term problem, the clinic must be able to provide ongoing care.
- Your client must have exhausted all other financial options.
- Your hospital will provide a matching or greater discount/donation of in-kind services
- Your client must reside in, or have significant connection to, the San Francisco Bay Area.

Condition Examples

(List is not all inclusive. Please reach out to us with any questions!)

- Infectious diseases (Parvo virus, feline panleukopenia, influenza, anaplasmosis...
- Hepatitis / Liver Disease


SFAFA SAN FRANCISCO AID for ANIMALS

LETTER FROM ANIMAL CARE & CONTROL

Dear Practice Owners/Managers,

Thank you for being part of the San Francisco animal community and caring for the many pets in our City.

We understand that this is a demanding time for veterinary practices. We are writing to remind you that the San Francisco Health Code requires that all rabies vaccination information for dogs must be reported to the Department of Animal Care and Control within 30 days of administration.

To maintain compliance please submit copies of your rabies information to acc.rabies@sfgov. org by the 5th of every month. Attached is a sample spreadsheet containing the required information. If your system is unable to produce a report, please provide a pdf version of your rabies certificates. The rabies certificates must contain the following fields:

Dog licensing is required by law as part of our rabies control program. Licensing also remains an essential tool in returning lost pets to their guardians. It also helps SFACC determine where to focus our outreach and emergency planning efforts.


The city is currently using licenses made by Pet Hub (www.pethub.com) that include a QR code where the basic plan enables anyone who finds a dog to scan the code and obtain owner-supplied information about the pet and its family, speeding reunification. Last fiscal year, SFACC reunited 54% of stray dogs with their owners through our lost and found programs.





CALIFORNIA VETERINARY MEDICAL RESERVE CORPS

Thousands of animals need care during and after disasters. Some 63% of California households have pets, including an estimated 10 million pet cats, nine

million dogs, and one million horses. Other pets, farm animals, and wildlife also need assistance during and after disasters like earthquakes, floods, and wildfires.

Veterinary professionals are vital to animals during disasters. The mission of the California Veterinary Medical Reserve Corps (CAVMRC) is to provide veterinary professionals with the training and credentialing necessary to support animal health and public health.

Deployment is always voluntary. Volunteers get involved at whatever level works for them – assistants are needed as well as leaders, part-time responders are as welcome as those who can help out for a week or two, plus there are ongoing roles in areas such as planning and disaster response. Volunteer participation can be a matter of life or death for rescued animals and means the world to the owners of those animals.

BENEFITS OF JOINING THE CAVMRC

The CAVMRC provides veterinary professionals:

- Credentialing necessary to support animal health and public health emergency response.
- Continuing education and training opportunities that allow you to strengthen your skills to better serve your practice, your community and our state.

Volunteer Vet Techs do not need to be licensed vet techs, but must have a minimum of one year experience working in a veterinary environment, and feel comfortable performing animal restraint and animal handling tasks within a limited clinic environment.
